

School Improvements Are On the Ballot in August 2014

Several years ago, the residents of the Avenue City School District decided that they would remain an independent district apart from the St. Joseph School District and/or the Savannah School District.

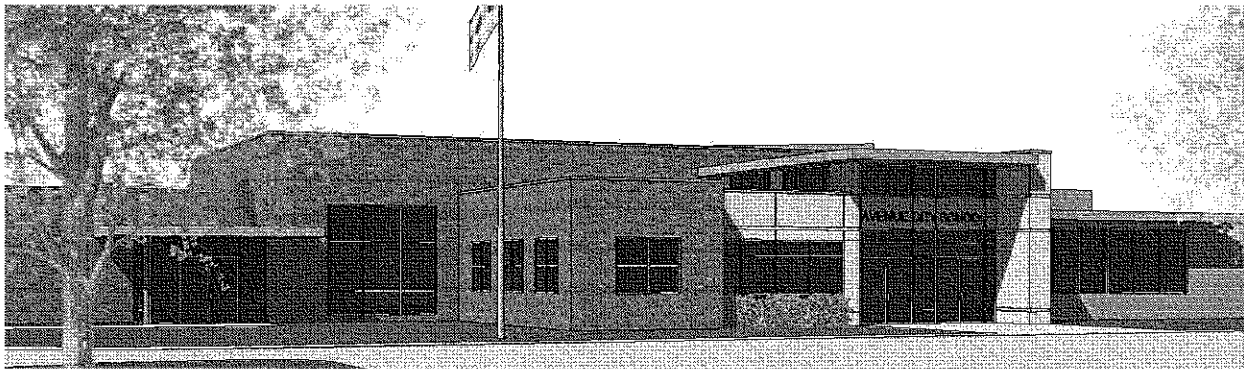
- In 1957, the original school was a product of school consolidation in the 1950s and consisted of 3 classrooms, 2 offices and a multipurpose room.
- Another addition occurred in 1966 which added two additional classrooms.
- Four additional classrooms were built in 1989.
- In 1999, the facility added 2 classrooms, a library, a computer lab, restrooms and a gym
- In 2008 three additional classrooms were constructed along with restrooms and a locker room facility, a preschool room and a storage room. The locker room/restroom facility was constructed to perform as a community storm shelter.

Each one of those facility improvements required a "YES" vote from the Avenue City patrons.

In August of 2014, the district will be asking the patrons once again to make improvements. Specifically, we want to address:

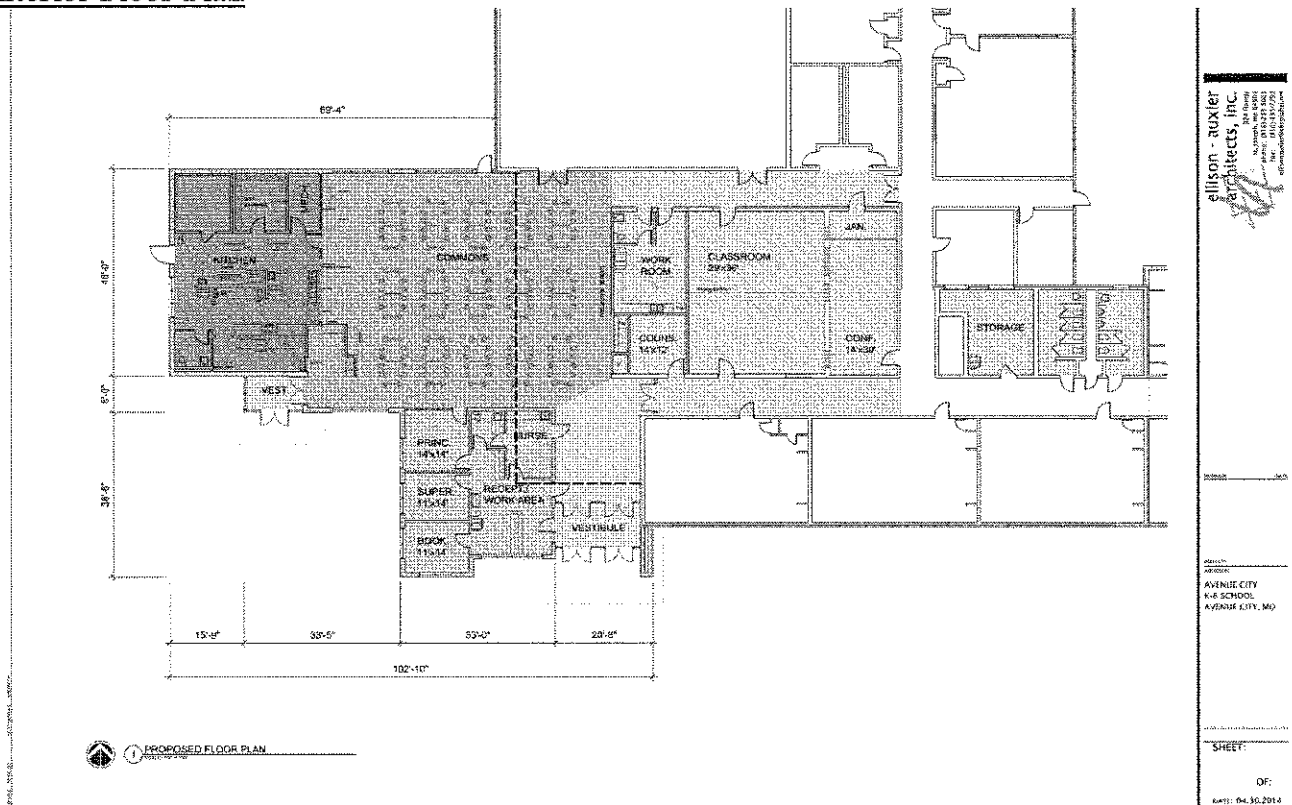
- A more visible and more secure entry way that requires visitors to come through the office prior to entering the hallways
- Additional parking to our west via purchase of approximately 3 acres
- A new enlarged expanded cafeteria/commons area
- A new kitchen facility to better prepare and serve meals for our students
- Remodel of the current cafeteria & kitchen space to additional classroom space
- An update and remodel of the restrooms in the original building

All of this could be done with a “YES VOTE” in August and without an increase of your taxes. A “no vote” means no progress will be made toward any of the improvements listed above. If you’re going to be on vacation on August 5th, you’ll be able to vote absentee by requesting a ballot from the Andrew County Clerk at the Courthouse in Savannah. While the district cannot provide information that asks you to vote “Yes” in August, we can encourage you to vote. We provide the information that if 58% of our voters say “YES” we can move forward with building improvements and if the approval rate is less than that, we cannot. This issue is up to you and you will have the ultimate say this August.

Propose facility improvement for Avenue City School in August 2014. This space includes the upgrade of the original restroom facilities as well as the conversion of the current cafeteria and kitchen area to classroom space, storage, counselor office, and teacher workroom space. The area also represents the proposed cafeteria space to be added. The area will be created to house current students as well as designed for increased enrollment for several years. The drawing also represents the proposed new kitchen space including freezer and dry storage area. There is also a newly designed entry way and the office spaces which will be lost when the kitchen and cafeteria are constructed. The placement of this office space allows staff to better observe and control access to the school.

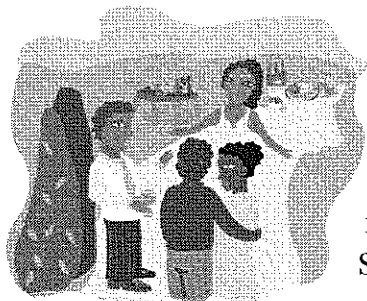
2014-2015 Kindergarten Camp

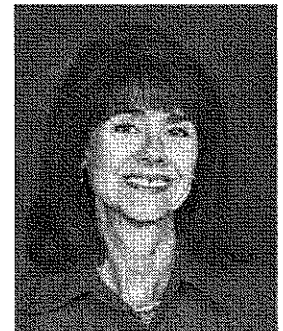

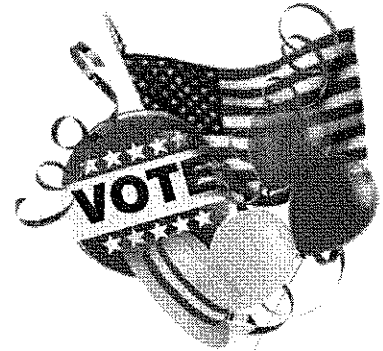
Register to Vote!

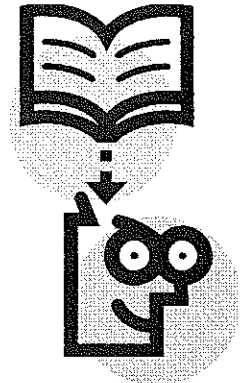


Treat Yourself to a Good Book!

How Does Parents as Teachers Support School Readiness?

Children who are prepared for kindergarten continue to do well in the early grades of elementary school, are more likely to graduate from high school and to go on to be successful in life.

Parents who participate in Parents as Teachers are more confident about their parenting and are more involved in their children's schooling...a key component of a child's success in school.

Research shows that participation in Parents as Teachers, together with preschool, not only positively impacts children's school readiness and school achievement scores, but also narrows the achievement gap between children in poverty and non-poverty households.

When children had at least two years of Parents as Teachers combined with a year of preschool, 82 percent of poor children were ready for school at kindergarten entry—a level identical to non-poverty children who had no Parents as Teachers or preschool experience.

Parents as Teachers children continue to achieve beyond kindergarten:

- They scored significantly higher on standardized measures of reading and math at the end of first grade than did comparison children. In addition, teachers rated Parents as Teachers children's achievement progress higher than control group children's progress in all areas.
- They continued to perform better than non-Parents as Teachers children on standardized tests of reading and math achievement in second grade. Compared to non-Parents as Teachers children, PAT children required half the rate of remedial and special education placements in third grade.

Did you Know that Children who participate in Parents as Teachers:

- Are more advanced at age 3 in language, social development, problem solving and other cognitive abilities;
- Score higher on kindergarten readiness tests;
- Score higher on standardized measures;
- Show better school readiness at the start of kindergarten;
- Achieve higher reading and math readiness at the end of kindergarten;
- Achieve higher kindergarten grades; and
- Require fewer remedial education placements in first grade.

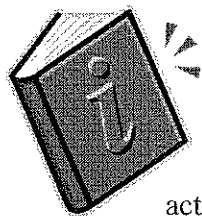

Library of Congress Grant Helps ACES Professional Acquire Master's Degree from University of Central Missouri

At the end of June, Jolynn Atoe, ACES librarian will finish a Master's degree in Library Science and Information Services from the University of Central Missouri. She was able to participate in this program as part of a grant through the Library of Congress. Through the program she has studied curriculum and learned how to structure our library program in a way that supports our students and staff as we implement the Common Core State Standards in our district.



Through the program, she has learned about and become skilled in many new types of technology. The ACES library now has its own website with links to many research tools, online books, and Web 2.0 tools. It is exciting to see all of the opportunities this technology holds for our students! Another aspect of the degree program required four action research projects, one of which led to the implementation of a student self-checkout station located in the computer lab. This allows students to have access to the library and the ability to check out library materials throughout the entire school day, as opposed to only the morning when the library is staffed. This small change led to over a thousand more checkouts this year compared to the 2012-2013 school year!

As Jolynn finishes up the program this month, she is beyond excited to have time freed up so that she can implement more of what she has learned!

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ACES Teachers Will Be Professionally Published

Two teachers at Avenue City School, Janis Pargas, fifth grade teacher, and Mandy Scott, third grade teacher have spent time this spring working to teach others about *Picturing-Writing*. Both teachers presented together at the annual Write to Learn Conference in Tan-Tar-A in March to demonstrate how to first create pictures with varied elements and to then use that picture to write descriptive paragraphs. This method can be used at any grade level, and Mrs. Pargas and Mrs. Scott led other teachers through the process to be used in schools across Missouri.

Recently, Mrs. Pargas and Mrs. Scott submitted an article to a professional journal, The Missouri Reader, to inform others of the process of using *Picturing-Writing* in the classroom and the benefits to students who are led through the process. The Missouri Reader is a peer-reviewed online journal that is published twice per year by the Missouri State Council of the International Reading Association as a forum for thoughtful consideration of issues, practices, research, and ideas in the field of literacy. Its purpose is to serve teachers, parents, consultants, supervisors, administrators, college/university faculty, and others interested in promoting literacy. This article will be published in the August 15, 2014 issue.

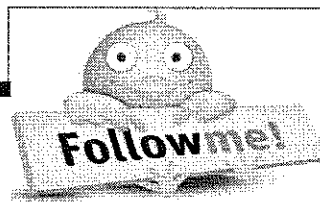
