## Avenue City Middle School Track Team

The Avenue City track team had a successful season this year with all athletes medaling at some time throughout the season. During the season, many records were broken with times and distances improving with every meet. With a small number of athletes, we were able to place high in a number of meets we participated in showing the versatility of each individual and their ability to place in many different events.

We attended 4 meets and broke 6 school records. They were:

- Girls 75 meter hurdles in 13.17 seconds by Olivia Stites and Ainsley Blake,

The 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls' team also took first place as a team at the Riverside Track meet. The athletes on this year's teams are:

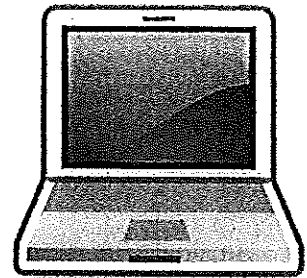

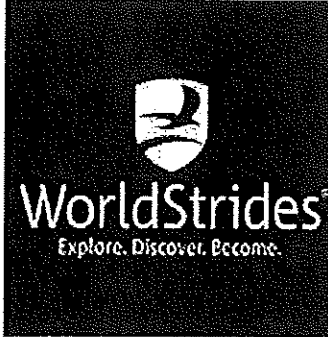

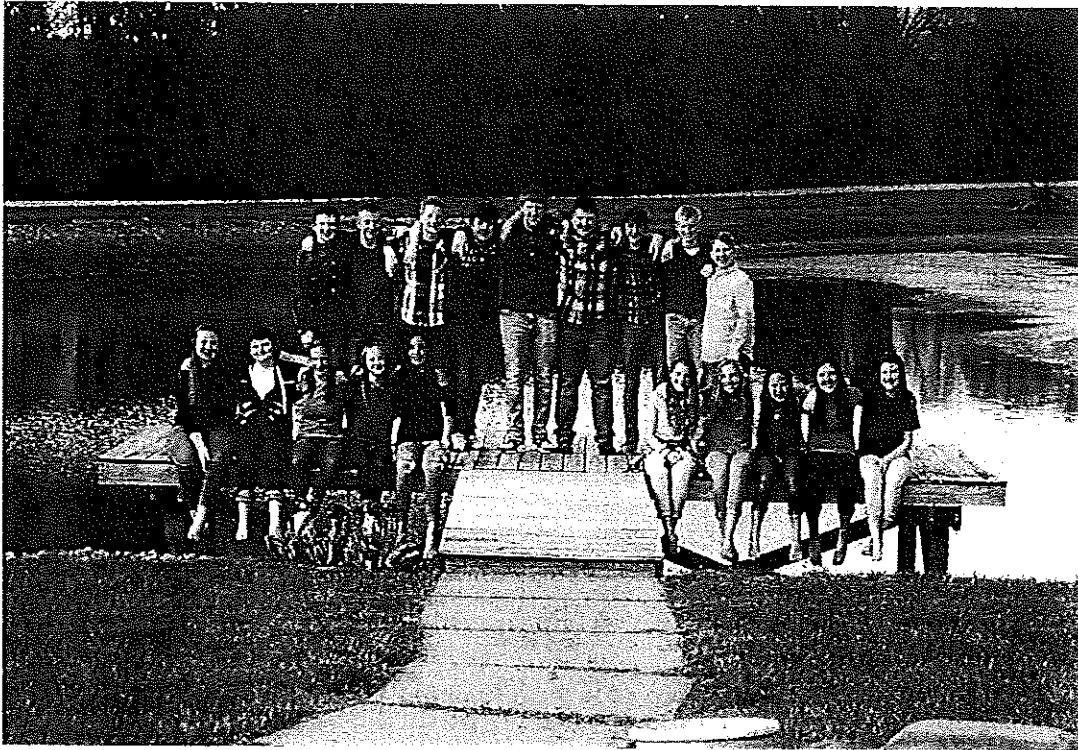
