Board Members and Superintendent Attend Training

Avenue City School District Board of Education Members Kody Hickman and Levi Davison and Superintendent Rebecca Grimes recently completed school board training sessions sponsored by the Missouri Association of Rural Education (MARE) held at the Holiday Inn in Maryville, MO. With the enactment of Senate Bill 380, "The Outstanding Schools Act of 1993," all newly elected/appointed school board members must complete at least eighteen hours and thirty minutes of orientation and training within one-year following their election/appointment. Specific topics included in the training were: Establishment of the Board and Responsibilities; The Effective Board Member; Public School Laws of Missouri (including the Missouri Open Meets and Record Law); School Policies; School Finance; Assessment of Students and the Local School District; Information about Preventing Sexual Abuse of Children; Emergency Preparedness; Safety and Security of School and District Long Range Planning (CSIP).

Attendance at the sessions, along with the successful completion on the pre-training requirements, fulfills the required 18.5 hours of certification training. Training is only provided by organizations that have received approval by the State Board of Education. MARE annually provides training at several locations around the state.

Principal Holcumbrink’s Message




ACES Community,

Preventing the Summer Reading Slide

Students who read during the summer can gain an average of one month of reading proficiency, while students who don't read can lose two to three months. This loss can add up over time and contribute to the reading achievement gap between lower-and-higher achieving students. The ACES Summer Reading Program promoted reading and was a big hit during the summer of 2024. Students were able to read with the Pony Express Therapy Dogs to kick things off. After that, we focused on the upcoming Olympics and played old fashioned games with Kathy Ridge, learned some Olympic history and made torches, did Olympic activities with Kathy Crawford, visited Ricky Dean's, and learned about sports reporting with KQ2's Chris Roush. We also had a fun visit from Will Stuck and learned CPR at the MWSU nursing lab! We finished off the summer program with a trip to the Conservation Department to learn about fishing. A good time was had by all!

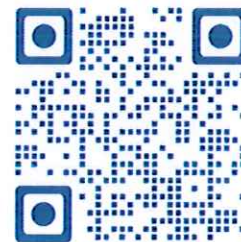

PUBLIC NOTICE

All responsible public agencies are required to locate, evaluate, and identify children with disabilities who are under the jurisdiction of the agency, regardless of the severity of the disability, including children attending private schools, children who live outside the district but are attending a private school within the district, highly mobile children, such as migrant and homeless children, children who are wards of the state, and children who are suspected of having a disability and in need of special education even though they are advancing from grade to grade. The Avenue City R-IX School District assures that it will provide a free, appropriate public education (FAPE) to all eligible children with disabilities between the ages of 3 and 21 under its jurisdiction. Disabilities include autism, deaf/blindness, emotional disorders, hearing impairment and deafness, intellectual disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairments, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment/blindness and young child with a developmental delay.

The Avenue City R-IX School District assures that it will provide information and referral services necessary to assist the State in the implementation of early intervention services for infants and toddlers eligible for the Missouri First Steps program.

The Avenue City R-IX School District assures that personally identifiable information collected, used, or maintained by the agency for the purposes of identification, evaluation, placement or provision of FAPE of children with disabilities may be inspected and/or reviewed by their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may request amendment to the educational record if the parent/guardian believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their child. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the district to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The Avenue City R-IX School District has developed a Local Compliance Plan for the implementation of State Regulations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This plan contains the agency's policies and procedures regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information and the agency's assurances that services are provided in compliance with the General Education Provision Act (GEPA). This plan may be reviewed at Avenue City School District Central Office 18069 Hwy 169, Cosby, MO 64436 during regular school hours.

This notice will be provided in native languages as appropriate.
