NOTES FROM SUPERINTENDENT GRIMES FOCUS ON THE END IN MIND -PROGRESS TAKES PERSEVERANCE AND GRIT

The 2023-2024 school year can be described as a progressive year. When I think about where we started in August of 2023 and where we are in March of 2024, I am impressed with the progress I have witnessed. Using time, discipline and grit; ACES keeps flying onward in a positive trajectory. Students are making



academic, physical, and social/emotional progress. Staff is making progress meeting the needs of students and the community. Board of Education Members working in conjunction with construction workers are making progress in our building project.

Student progress in our district continues to amaze me. Based on our last district wide benchmark assessments, in four months of instruction students were making an average of eight months of progress in the reading/language area. In the area of mathematics, students are making over twelve months of progress in four months of instruction. Some objectives cannot be measured by standardized tests. I am able to witness small progress each day. At the beginning of the school year, students who did not know letter sounds are now reading sentences and books; students are adding and subtracting fractions; technology is being used to efficiently complete projects; students are skipping, hopping, tying shoes; cooperation and teamwork are being utilized; and multi-step directions are being followed. Have students failed at some tasks? Of course. However, through perseverance, hard work, and grit, they are overcoming. They are forming a community of learners by making progress and supporting each other. Forward trajectory each day adds up to HUGE results for our students.



Brooner Construction and Crane's crew is making positive progress on our building addition. Dirt is being moved, walls are being demolished, floors have been formed and poured, and steel is on site and being installed. The crew exemplified grit and determination to continue to work through brutal cold temperatures, snow, and ice to keep the project on schedule. Staff, students, and community members have worked cooperatively through the minor inconveniences of the construction project to keep the end in mind. All involved realize that every block we place is a foundation for our students and community's onward trajectory.

As the spring season approaches, our district must be determined to continue with perseverance and grit to finish strong. The fourth quarter is tough on students, teachers, and parents. There is so much to be done in a short amount of time. We need to continue to make positive progress in the few months we have left of school. Help your child stay focused by detailed planning, keeping routines consistent, and making sure all communication is clear. Do not let "spring fever" take over. Summer is just around the corner, with perseverance and grit we will continue to soar forward in our positive trajectory!



Professional Development News

The Avenue City School staff recently completed assessing the Department of Education's standards for Social Studies curriculum, which included the most updated information of grade level standards. Staff has looked at various options for updating our Social Studies curriculum and supplies that correspond best with these state standards.

As a school, we are using The Essential 55 to create a positive behavior system in which expectations in all areas of the school are consistent and provide a positive environment for the students. We have revisited our expectations throughout the school year during in services to discuss the success of how this has been implemented and make changes to what needs to be improved. This is an ongoing process that we will continue to implement this year and in upcoming years, but we feel this development has been a valuable tool for our students and staff alike.

As we are now into the second semester of the school year, our staff will begin looking at opportunities to attend summer workshops and trainings. This will allow us to grow professionally and give us great information and access to new resources to use in the classroom to meet the needs of the students.



Mr. Don Lawrence Recognized as "Outstanding Emeritus Educator"



Don Lawrence served Missouri public education for 41 years. He attended high school at St. Joseph Central. He was the only male in his elementary education program during his entire schooling at Missouri Western State University. Don obtained his degree in three years and was hired in the Savannah R-III School District to teach all subjects to 10-year-old 5th graders when he was only 20 years old. Two years later, he was made an elementary principal and seven years later, he assumed his first job as superintendent. Don served as superintendent at Jamestown C-1 for three years. He then returned to Savannah where he served as their

superintendent for 17 years before retiring in 2011. After 30 days of retirement, Don assumed the part-time job of superintendent for the Avenue City School District. He remained in that capacity until August of 2023.

Mr. Lawrence will be recognized by the Missouri Association of School Administrators as an Outstanding Emeritus Educator in March of 2024 at the Lake of the Ozarks.
