

From Superintendent Lawrence:

Dear Parents and Patrons,

We are less than a month away from starting the 2021-22 school year. When we released for summer in May, I was so hopeful that we could begin the 2021-22 school year with COVID in the rearview mirror. In early July, it became apparent that the disease had other ideas. As I write this, Andrew County has 114 new cases of COVID-19. MOSAIC's hospitalized numbers exceed 50, as they did in the height of 2020-21. Like it or not, this disease is something with which we are going to have to deal with until further notice. We shall deal with this challenge as best we can and know that our children are as adaptable as we let them be. Their adaptability will need to include the following for the first part of 2021-22.

<u>Wearing of masks:</u> Required on the buses and in common areas where students pass one another. Masks in the classroom will be optional and something you need to decide for your children. We saw last year that requiring students to be in facemasks all day resulted in them not wearing them appropriately. We saw that if we quarantined someone from a classroom, masks were not going to keep us from quarantining the entire classroom. Hence, the option to wear or not wear inside the classroom.

<u>Physical distancing:</u> A fancy term for grouping is cohorts. I prefer to be as simple as possible. We will keep our students with their classmates during instructional time and in the lunchroom. Breakfast will be in the classroom. Students must remain socially distanced from students who are not in their classroom.

<u>Handwashing and respiratory etiquette:</u> We will once again be on the handwashing bandwagon. There is no better way to reduce all spreading of communicable disease than through handwashing and covering your mouth when you cough and sneeze.

<u>Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities:</u> While the CDC now acknowledges that COVID-19 is less likely to be passed through surface contacts, we will be cleaning diligently again this year. Students will be able to travel to art, P.E., and music and they may be asked to use hand wipes to clean their work area upon their arrival. We will continue to utilize non-touch fixtures in our restroom facilities. Students should provide their own drinking water and/or containers for drinking water. Our drinking fountains will only be used as stations for refilling containers.

<u>Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine:</u> The school will rely on the county health department to do the majority of contact tracing. Quarantining of students and classrooms may occur as they did in 2020-21.

<u>Screening:</u> We will screen bus riders for high body temperatures as we did in 2020-21. We will not screen all students as they enter school this year. We will depend on parents to screen their children for a fever each day before school. We will not screen visitors because visitors will not be allowed in school as was the case in 2020-21.

The items above are only a small sample of the multitude of things we have had to plan for over the past two years. The Avenue City School had much success in 2020-21 dealing with the issues of the COVID-19 pandemic. We initiated 2020-21 with face-to-face instruction on the first scheduled day of school. We experienced very few classroom quarantines in 2020-21. During the times we were in quarantine mode, students were engaged with virtual learning techniques and little learning time was lost. We exited school without masks because the numbers said that we could. It was because of you and your cooperation that we experienced this type of success. We rely on that continued cooperation until this disease runs its course and life can return to normal. Until then, we shall do the best that we can each day of this school year. Knowing that all things change, we will rely upon our Creator for his divine guidance.



PUBLIC NOTICE

All responsible public agencies are required to locate, evaluate, and identify children with disabilities who are under the jurisdiction of the agency, regardless of the severity of the disability, including children attending private schools, children who live outside the district but are attending a private school within the district, highly mobile children, such as migrant and homeless children, children who are wards of the state, and children who are suspected of having a disability and in need of special education even though they are advancing from grade to grade. The Avenue City School District assures that it will provide information and referral services necessary to assist the State in the implementation of early intervention services for infants and toddlers eligible for the Missouri First Steps program.

The Avenue City School District assures that personally identifiable information collected, used, or maintained by the agency for the purposes of identification, evaluation, placement or provision of FAPE of children with disabilities may be inspected and/or reviewed by their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may request amendment to the educational record if the parent/guardian believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their child. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the district to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The Avenue City School District has developed a Local Compliance Plan for the implementation of State Regulations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This plan contains the agency's policies and procedures regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information and the agency's assurances that services are provided in compliance with the General Education Provision Act (GEPA).
