Construction Update: The 98-cent tax levy at Avenue City School District has been used throughout history to build many different projects. It was used to build the middle school wing, to build the new cafeteria, and the same 98 cents was used to add safety and security for our students. In April of 2023, the voters of Avenue City School overwhelmingly passed Proposition Avenue City School. The passing of this proposition allows the district to use the same 98-cent tax levy to build additional classrooms and a high school regulation gymnasium.

The district will be "building the plane as we fly it" during the 23-24 school year. What does "building the plane as we fly it" mean? The district will be actively engaged in educating our students during this construction phase. During the summer of 2023, Board of Education Members have been working with Ellison- Auxier Architects, Inc. of St. Joseph, MO to finalize plans and begin construction. During this phase, all will need to adapt and remain flexible. As Superintendent, my focus will be to assure the educational process during the construction phase is not interrupted. Region D Recycling & Waste Management District Awards Grant to Avenue City School

Avenue City Elementary School has been awarded \$4,000 from Region D Recycling & Waste Management District for recycled content picnic tables.

Grant funds are made available for waste reduction and recycling projects from tipping fees collected at landfills in Missouri and transfer stations when trash is taken out of state. The fees are collected by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Waste Management Program and distributed to the twenty solid waste districts located throughout the state. Region D Recycling & Waste Management District members are Andrew, Buchanan, Clinton and DeKalb Counties. There are eight member cities as well.

The project demonstrates the full circle of recycling. Materials purchased with the grant funds are constructed with recycled materials.

8 Ways to Prepare Your Child For Preschool

Preschool is often our children's first experience away from home. It can be scary for children and for parents. Here are eight tips to help you and your child have a successful first day of Preschool!

- Meet the teacher Take your child to the Open House offered by the school to help them become familiar
 with the classroom, the teachers and the playground.
- Playdates If you know a few of the students/families that will be in the class, try to organize a gettogether at a park or in the neighborhood.
- Practice separation -Leave your child with others for short lengths of time so that they know you will
 return.
- Backpack and lunchbox Before school starts, help your child be excited about starting school by
 empowering them to pick out a backpack and lunchbox. In the backpack, the child may need a special
 blanket or stuffed animal, room for an 8.5 x 11" folder, extra clothes and extra space for all that
 artwork! An ice pack in the lunchbox will be necessary.
- Independent skills If your child is staying all day, ask them to help you prepare the lunch. That way, they will feel like they have some control and will begin to understand what is really happening that day.
- Focus on your child Make the whole experience as fun as possible. Give your child your full attention on the way to school. Phone calls can wait. Keep screens off to and from school. Tell your child stories about when you were a little and how much you liked school. Sing songs. Try a spin-off version of "If you're happy and you know it, clap your hands." Make it, "If you're excited to go to school, clap your hands!" Be excited, smile a lot, and be happy.
- Communicate Tell them it is okay to be afraid, but that there are always adults to help them.
- **Don't linger** When it's time for drop-off, keep your goodbyes short, sweet and simple. (A quick hug, "love you", and leave.)

PUBLIC NOTICE

All responsible public agencies are required to locate, evaluate, and identify children with disabilities who are under the jurisdiction of the agency, regardless of the severity of the disability, including children attending private schools, children who live outside the district but are attending a private school within the district, highly mobile children, such as migrant and homeless children, children who are wards of the state, and children who are suspected of having a disability and in need of special education even though they are advancing from grade to grade. The Avenue City School District assures that it will provide a free, appropriate public education (FAPE) to all eligible children with disabilities between the ages of 3 and 21 under its jurisdiction. Disabilities include autism, deaf/blindness, emotional disorders, hearing impairment and deafness, intellectual disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairments, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment/blindness and young child with a developmental delay.

The Avenue City School District assures that it will provide information and referral services necessary to assist the State in the implementation of early intervention services for infants and toddlers eligible for the Missouri First Steps program.

The Avenue City School District assures that personally identifiable information collected, used, or maintained by the agency for the purposes of identification, evaluation, placement or provision of FAPE of children with disabilities may be inspected and/or reviewed by their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may request amendment to the educational record if the parent/guardian believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their child. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the district to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The Avenue City School District has developed a Local Compliance Plan for the implementation of State Regulations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This plan contains the agency's policies and procedures regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information and the agency's assurances that services are provided in compliance with the General Education Provision Act (GEPA). This plan may be reviewed at the Avenue City School District School Office during any day school is in session from 8:00 AM- 3:00 PM.

This notice will be provided in native languages as appropriate.
