Each year, M.A.R.E. requests and receives nominations from member districts for individuals and school districts to receive consideration for these awards. Each selected recipient is then honored at the organizations' annual conference Friday evening banquet.

#### Traffic Lights Up and Running, Finally

When the idea of installing flashing traffic signals was first discussed, I was told that someone had tried to get that accomplished several years ago. Apparently, the highway department back then said no and apparently they were adamant about it. Spin the calendar ahead 10 years or so and here we have it.

Avenue City School Board gave their blessing and provided the funding for two traffic signals on 169 highway in July of 2016. The lights slow traffic between 7:30 and 8:45 as well as from 2:30-3:45 on a daily basis when school is in session. The speed limit is lowered to 50 miles per hour when the signals are flashing.

While many safety measures have been installed in the past two years, the installation of the highway signals is probably the most visible. The cost of the signals and installation was approximately \$10,000. The lights were installed by Action Electric from St. Joseph. The MoDOT personnel who assisted us in getting the ball moving were Joseph Turner and Nicole Steele. Upon completion and approval, MoDOT assumes responsibility for repair and maintenance of the signals.

The Board, faculty, students and I extend our thanks to all those who allowed, approved and worked to make this project happen. We also thank the Andrew County Sheriff's Department and the Missouri Highway Patrol for enforcing the new safety measure. We are most thankful this project did not take another 10 years to complete. Working together always makes things better.

# School Board Candidate Filing Opens in December

It's time to prepare for the April school board election. Candidate filing begins December 13, 2016.

- There are three seats up for election for a three year term.
- Filing began at 8 AM on December 13 and ends at 5:00 PM on January 17, 2017. On other days the district will only accept candidate filing during the business hours. (8:00 AM 4:00 PM)
- Filing will not occur on holidays and other days the district offices are closed, including on days in which the district is closed due to inclement weather.

The district will provide each candidate a copy of a summary of campaign laws provided by the Missouri Ethics Commission and written notice of the candidate's obligation to file a personal financial disclosure statement.

#### Information on the School Board Organization

The qualified voters of the School District shall annually on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of April, elect two directors for terms of three years, except, effective for Board elections beginning in April of 1993, and each three years thereafter, when three directors shall be elected in compliance with regulations specified in state law.

An election shall not be held if the number of candidates who have filed for the Board is equal to the number of positions available.

#### Qualified Voters in the School District

An individual must be a registered voter in order to vote in a school election. In order to vote, a person must be eighteen (18) years of age or older, must be a citizen of the United States, and must reside in the School District thirty (30) days.

#### Candidate Qualification - Method of Filing

Qualified applicants for the Board may file for office beginning at 8:00 a.m. in the Superintendent's office commencing on the sixteenth (16th) Tuesday prior to the election and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the eleventh (11th) Tuesday before the election. The candidate shall declare his/her intent to become a candidate, in person and in writing to the secretary of the Board of Education. The names of qualified candidates shall be placed on the ballot in the order of filing. The notice of election and certification of candidates must be submitted to the county clerk by the tenth Tuesday prior to the election. Candidates must comply with all of the prevailing laws concerning eligibility and campaign financing. Candidates must be citizens of the United States and resident taxpayers of the District, reside in his/her state for one year next preceding their election or appointment, and be at least twenty-four (24) years of age. Each newly elected or appointed director shall qualify and take his/her oath of office in the manner prescribed by law and according to Policy 0330 - Oath of Office.
