

# News from the Top Dawgl September 1, 2023

#### Math:

We will continue working on solving simple/ multi-step equations and equations with variables. Your first quiz will be on Friday over lessons 1.1-1.2. I'll assign you a practice quiz. After you take the practice quiz, go to your reports to see the answers and the ones that you missed. Try figuring out your error! Do extra odd problems from sections 1.1-1.2 and check your answers in the back of the book STUDY!

Please make sure you can log on to Big Ideas from home so that you will be able to work on homework from home. Please remember to use your calculator only to check your work, not to do your homework!

#### ELA:

We had a great week reviewing the R.A.C.E.S. writing strategy. I am working with the students to be creative in how they word the different parts of a paragraph. Ask your child if they know what "silver dollar" words are. Mrs. Proctor taught them long ago! I'm looking for the students to step up and use more specific vocabulary words to create unique writing.

Next week, we will be learning about plagiarism. Students will complete a scavenger hunt to research what plagiarism is, how it is done, its consequences, and how to avoid doing it. Students will also be reviewing how to use commas and quotations, and how to correctly cite evidence.

## American History:

Now that we have reviewed basic map skills and discussed what our continent and country was like before Europeans arrived in these areas, we will begin learning from our first chapter, "Three Worlds Before 1500". You will have readings and daily review quizzes to complete. We will also focus time on studying the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001.

#### Science:

Next week, students work in groups to prepare to design an energy system for the rescue workers. The Design Problem: Get energy to the batteries in the rescue workers' electrical devices, even when the power is out. Students will learn: 1. Scientists and engineers have designed many ways to capture human kinetic energy and convert it to electrical energy. 2. Electrical energy can be stored in a battery as potential energy so it can be used later.

3. Sharing expertise is an important practice in science. 4. Design criteria are goals that must be met in order to solve a problem.

Reading Circle Requirements have been given out to the students.. See the due dates on the right side of this memo. Students will complete all their non-fiction reading requirements if they complete all the required AR tests on the right. They will need to read about 9 extra fiction books on their own to complete the fiction requirements. If we read a fiction novel in class, they will be able to count that as well for a fiction book All fiction and non-fiction books will have an AR test over them. Students will complete the AR tests with an ACES staff member at school.
